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From the Principal

KEY IMPROVEMENT PRIORITIES FOR 2016

We had a fantastic response from families about the important priorities we should focus on this year.

The following are the priorities that the parents and staff have agreed to work on for this year:

- Ⓢ Professional Development of Teachers – Art & Science of Teaching' Data Analysis for Planning, Teaching & Learning and Assessment; Intervention Model particularly around Processes, Tracking and Data Analysis. The following meetings have been put into place to support the ongoing learning of our staff:
 - PLM (Professional Learning Meetings) – ALL teachers meet every fortnight Tuesday for 1.5 hours. Teachers look at research around teaching, teaching strategies, teaching and learning programs etc.
 - KIPs (Key Improvement Priority Meetings) – Year level teachers meet with the HOC (Heads of Curriculum) and Master Teacher and focus on the planning, assessment and differentiating teaching for individuals and small groups specifically related to our agreed priorities for the year.
 - YL (Year Level) – Year level teachers meet with their year level facilitators to discuss issues related to smooth classroom organisation, behaviour and any other issues that are relevant
- Ⓢ Reading – Whole School Approach; Focus on:- Comprehension, Explicit Teaching of Guaranteed Vocabulary, Phonics and Oral Language
- Ⓢ Writing – Daily Writing; Explicit Teaching of Writing Genres; Writing Moderation each term
- Ⓢ Numeracy – Intervention Support and Gifted & Talented extension opportunities

PRIORITY SCHOOL REVIEW

Our school had our support school review this week. They have given us a verbal report of their recommendations, and they will send a formal written report once it is finalised. We will then go into a planning phase to take our school into the future.

EVERY DAY COUNTS & ABSENCES

I would like to remind all our parents how important it is that all students attend school every day. **Every Day Counts** is a state wide initiative addressing the issue of student attendance at school. The initiative is designed to change parent, community and student attitudes to school attendance. It requires the support of both parents and the community if student attendance is to be successfully addressed.

Every Day Counts promotes four key messages:

- All children should be enrolled at school and attend on every school day.
- Schools will monitor, communicate and implement strategies to improve regular school attendance.
- Truancy can place a student in unsafe situations and impact on their future employability and life choices.
- Attendance at school is the responsibility of everyone in the community. Research shows that higher rates of attendance at school are related to higher achievement. We know that students can get sick from time to time, so please notify the office of any legitimate absences. We thank you for your support in achieving the best educational results for your children. We are following up with every students' absence by phoning home and then sending letters home. If you get a letter, you need to record the reason for the absence on the form, sign it and send it back to the office to update our records. If parents do not provide reasonable explanations, we then have to have a meeting with you about your child's absences.

RESPONSIBLE BEHAVIOUR PLAN

At this month's meeting we discussed the review of the Responsible behaviour Plan and the changes that were put forward and voted on by staff. The following changes were also voted for by the P&C members in a ballot.

We will now undergo a week of transition to the new elements of the plan. The new plan will not become effective until Week 3 to give students, teachers and parent's time to get to know the changes that have taken place and how it will work in the school.

Students are advised that they should spend their PBL Hero Dollars at this shop over the next 3 weeks. Hero Dollars will not be given out from Week 3, but students will still be able to cash them in at the shop until the end of week 3. The shop will be closed from Week 4 onwards.

ANZAC DAY 2016

ANZAC Day is Monday 25 April 2016. This is an important and serious occasion. ANZAC Day goes beyond the anniversary of the landing on Gallipoli in 1915. It is the day on which we remember Australians who served and died in all wars, conflicts, and peacekeeping operations. The spirit of Anzac, with its human qualities of courage, mateship, sacrifice, generosity, freedom, and a fair go for all, continues to have meaning and relevance for our national identity.



On ANZAC Day, Australians across our nation unite to remember and honour those who have served with distinction in our defence force over many decades. We honour all men, women and animals for their duty to our country, their determined fighting spirit and for the appalling conditions many have so bravely endured. We also honour all the men and women who have served our nation in uniform over the past one hundred years. Their diligence has kept the ANZAC spirit alive and ensured it is just as relevant to Australia today as it was during the First World War. We especially honour those who have given their lives in service to their country.

NAPLAN NATIONAL ASSESSMENT PROGRAM

Literacy and Numeracy

NAPLAN IN WEEK 5

Purpose of the tests.

The NAPLAN tests are designed to assess the skills of Australian students in literacy and numeracy. The specific purposes are:

- to collect data from the population of Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 students for reporting to parents/carers and schools for systematic reporting
- to accommodate the assessment of students against national minimum standards.

What is tested?

A series of tests will assess areas of literacy and numeracy.

The following areas of **literacy** are assessed:

- Language conventions - spelling, grammar and punctuation
- Writing - knowledge and control of written language
- Reading - comprehension.

As in other years, students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 will be required to respond to a stimulus in the NAPLAN Writing test.

In **numeracy**, the content areas assessed are:

- Number
- Measurement, chance and data
- Space
- Algebra, function and pattern (formal algebra for Year 9 only).

Results from the tests will provide important information about children's progress in literacy and numeracy. Following the tests, schools and students will receive a statement of performance in relation to the national minimum standards.

Format of the tests.

The program is conducted over the 3 days from 10–12 May 2016. Usually students sit the tests in their own schools. For **Years 3 and 5** there will be 4 tests: Language conventions, Writing, Reading and Numeracy. For **Years 7 and 9** there will be 5 tests: Language conventions, Writing, Reading, Numeracy-non-calculator and Numeracy-calculator allowed.

For the Writing test, students will be given a stimulus and asked to write a response to the task in a maximum of three pages. There will be one Writing stimulus for students in Years 3 and 5; and a second different Writing stimulus for students in Years 7 and 9. However, both will be of the same genre. The response formats for questions on all other test papers will be either multiple choice (shade a bubble to indicate the answer) or constructed response (write the answer in a box or on a line).

DON'T MISS ONE MOB TO CGEN — SCREENING 17 APRIL ON NITV

The experiences of 56 South East Queensland Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander state school student dancers preparing to perform in last year's [Creative Generation \(CGEN\)](#) is the subject of an inspiring new documentary screening soon on NITV. The students appearing in *One Mob to CGEN* took part in Bangarra Dance Theatre's Rekindling program, which aims to strengthen cultural connections with school learning and encourage school attendance and post-school careers. *One Mob to CGEN* screens on NITV on 17 April at 7.30 pm directly after a repeat screening of *Our Spirit – Connecting Culture to Learning*, a documentary which showcased Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander state school students taking part in CGEN 2014.

SHOW YOUR SUPPORT FOR STUDENTS WITH AUTISM IN APRIL

Do you know that there are more than 12,000 students with autism enrolled in Queensland state schools? April is Autism Awareness Month and our school is committed to working with families and services to support students with autism and ensure that they get the best possible start in life.

This year the Queensland Government launched Australia's first Autism Hub to provide students with autism, their families and schools across the state with more support. Located in Brisbane, the \$2 million centre offers expert advice, training and resources to parents, educators and health professionals. Proposal	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Peer Support Program - Years 1-6 participate in the Peer Support Program which is designed for Peer Leaders to reciprocally teach small groups of younger students about positive social and emotional behaviours. Topics are delivered on a term basis, and include issues such as: Bullying, Resilience, Relationships, Optimism, Taking Opportunities and Harmony and Values. Peer Support Groups are composed of vertically arranged groups of students, to increase interaction and communication between year levels and allow Student Leaders to lead by example.The TALKABOUT Program will be used in Prep. It was developed by Alex Kelly, a speech and language therapist, with 30 years' experience of working with people who have difficulties with their social skills, self-esteem and their relationships. The TALKABOUT program is a practical resource to develop social skills for children. The program helps schools develop students' social skills in an effective and measurable way. TALKABOUT helps us to set social skills targets and measure and report on progress in a positive way to parents.	85%	100%
Current Situation	A PBL Token system is in place throughout the school. Children are given a token both in class and in the playground for appropriate behaviour. The tokens are added up and converted to 'Hero Dollars' These can be spent at the Reward Shop at breaks.	23%	40%
Proposal	PBL Tickets slips are given to students. They write their name and class on it. One half of the Ticket is placed in the box in Administration, and the child takes the second half home to parents to inform them of their child's positive behaviour/s that day. The Tickets go into boxes for <u>Prep to Year 2</u> , and <u>Year 3 to Year 6</u> in the office. Two Tickets are drawn out of each box on Parade every week. Those children receive a prize and recognition from the rest of the school. Specialist Teachers also have a box that the Tickets are placed into and 2 are drawn out each week on Parade as well.	77%	60%
Current Situation	Certificates are awarded for the number of tokens given out, not specific behaviours.	0%	0%
Proposal	Class Based Parade Awards - Each week, class teachers select two students from their class for an award at Parade. Awards are presented for positive LEARNING behaviours, and for positive SOCIAL behaviours. These awards are recorded as a positive behaviour for the student in OneSchool by the class teacher. These behaviours are aligned to the schools improvement agenda.	100%	100%
Current Situation	No school pledge.	4%	0%
Proposal	Class rules and expectations are aligned to the Mt Warren Park State School Pledge that is said on parade each week: "We are striving to succeed. We are Learners, We are Safe, and We are Respectful."	96%	100%
Current Situation	Teachers manage their students time out and play break consequences themselves, meaning that often times teachers have no break at all during the day to contact parents, do marking or planning.	0%	0%
Proposal	Responsible Thinking Room - The RTR is a classroom staffed during the play breaks to supervise students who have lost their play break time as a consequence of behaviour. Students are placed in the RTR by the Principal, the DPs or their delegate. Students are given the allocated eating time and attend the RTR during their play break. Parents may be notified, either by letter or phone call as appropriate to the situation and this contact is recorded in OneSchool. The 'Have a Go' Club will also use the TALKABOUT Program so that students are learning behaviour and social skills in a fun, interactive and engaging way. 'Have a Go' will now be called TALKABOUT.	100%	100%


ANZAC Day Monday, 25th April

The ceremony is an important event on our school calendar and you are most welcome to attend. We ask that the audience refrain from applauding during this solemn occasion.

Monday 25th April Beenleigh March and Memorial Service:



The march will form in York Street, at the usual place, but will now proceed directly along York to George Street, then right into James Street via the new area at the Court House and up to the Crete Street Memorial for the service which is scheduled to begin at 11 am. Student wishing to march with the school are asked to meet staff in full school uniform and SunSafe hat on the corner of York and Kokoda St 10am.

Parents are welcome to march or drop their children with staff and then pick them up at the Crete St memorial before or after the service not during. NAPLAN

There is, however, scope for some children to be withdrawn from the testing, be exempt or to complete the tests under special consideration conditions. Please talk to your child's teacher in regard to your child completing these tests as there are specific forms that need to be completed before Monday 9th of May.

Cash Collection Procedures – Cash Window

The Cash Window is located in the Admin Block. We offer several methods of payment being cash, cheque, EFTPOS, B-Point (see above) and Internet Banking. The cash window will be **OPEN every Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday from 8am to 10am.**

Late Payments - It is a solid requirement that all events be paid for by the due date which is stated on all permission / information notes sent home to parents.

Late payments cannot be accepted under any circumstances so please keep updated by checking our newsletter each fortnight.

Refunds - Refunds can only be given in part. This means if there is bus travel involved for the event this is **NOT** refundable. Whether your child attends or not the buses have been booked and need to be paid for. You must complete a "Refund Request" Form available from Administration.

At your bus stop:

- Be on time.
- Wait in a safe location
- Hail the bus driver
- Stand back from the edge of the road as the bus approaches.

When travelling on the bus:

- Don't push and shove
- Respect other people and their property
- Follow driver instructions and bus rules
- Stand or sit in the right place
- Store your bag safely
- Keep your hands and feet to yourself.

When exiting a bus:

- Press the stop button once to let the driver know you want to get off at the next stop
- Remove your headphones so you can hear traffic and driver instructions
- Make sure you have all your belongings
- Stand back and allow doors to open
- Don't rush when leaving the bus
- Always look in both directions before crossing the road
- Be aware of other people and cars on the road
- Wait in a safe location and wait for the bus to move away
- Check the road is clear before you cross
- Do not run to cross the road.
