Do You Have A Child Starting School In 2016?

Supporting Successful Transitions

Do you have a child starting school in 2016? Schools, early childhood education and care services and families all have a part to play in helping children enjoy a positive start to school.

Information for Families

Starting school is an exciting and significant time in every child's life. A positive start to school can lead to children developing a lifelong love of learning. We encourage our families to work in partnership with Mt Warren Park SS to ensure all children enjoy a successful transition to school.

What is transition to school?

Transition to school begins well before a child starts school and ends when your child feels safe, secure and a sense of belonging at school. It involves a range of partners working together to provide experiences that will help your child gain the skills and confidence they need to adjust to their new school environment. Orientation activities that help your child become familiar with their new school environment and routines are an important component of your child's transition to school.

What does it mean for my child?

Successful transition can improve social skills, reduce behavioural problems and ultimately improve academic outcomes. All partners in your child's support network will play an important role in your child's transition to school. Your child's early childhood education and care service, our school and relevant community organisations will work together to help you and your child feel prepared for and confident to start school.

How can I help prepare my child for school?

Children who can play cooperatively with others, explain their thoughts, ideas and feelings and follow routines and directions are socially and emotionally prepared for school. There are many simple ways you as a parent can encourage your child's development of these skills.

Talking with your child about what they see and understand about everyday family events is a simple way you can support your child's development.

Reading together, especially stories about change or starting school will develop your child's language, thinking and literacy skills. Visit your local library or ask your child's early childhood teacher for recommendations on books to read.

Enrolling your child in a Queensland Government-approved kindergarten program is an important way you can help prepare them for Prep. Kindergarten programs help children develop a love of learning, build their confidence and make friends in the year before they start school.

As it gets closer to the start of school, set up a morning and evening routine to help reduce the number of changes they will experience. The routine can include packing their lunch box, dressing themselves, practising the trip to school.

Helping your child to work out answers to problems or concerns will help them develop coping strategies and make them more independent and confident. Encourage them to ask for help if they need it and talk to their new Prep teacher, another staff member or an older 'school buddy' about their concerns.

Talk to your child's early childhood teacher to get their suggestions for other ways you can help prepare your child for school.

How can I support my child's transition to school?

You have an important role in your child's transition to school. Here are some helpful hints on ways you can support them:

- get to know other Prep children and their families as soon as appropriate, as building these relationships can foster a sense of belonging for you and your child
- know your child's concerns and provide comfort and support by talking together
- speak positively about their new school
- get to know your child's new school and the staff by participating in any school orientation activities
- contribute to the development of your child's Transition Statement and provide a copy of the completed statement to your child's Prep teacher.

As a parent, you know your child best. Talking to the Prep teacher about your child's other prior to school experiences will also help them understand and prepare to meet your child's learning, social and emotional needs.

Changes To School Immunisation Program From 2016

The [School Immunisation Program](#) plays an important role in protecting our community from vaccine preventable diseases. In 2016, the program will offer vaccinations to all Year 7 and 8 students. From 2017, the program will only offer vaccinations to Year 7 students. Queensland's School Immunisation Program (SIP) provides parents with the opportunity to have their high school student/s vaccinated for free through their school. Coordinated by Queensland Health, the vaccination program is offered to all Queensland state and non-state secondary schools.

Vaccines recommended by the National Immunisation Program Schedule are available free of charge to registered vaccine service providers implementing school immunisation clinics.

Funding For Queensland Schools

Queensland schools will be able to deliver more for their students, with increases in Gonski funding to go straight to schools next year. Under the "Investing for Success" program, schools now know how much extra they will get in 2016 and can plan how to use these extra resources to benefit students. Schools will see a total of \$480 million extra over the 2016 and 2017 school years, up from the \$183 million extra in 2015.

The new Queensland Government has changed the funding formula for 2016 so it is closer to the needs-based system envisaged by the Gonski Review, while ensuring that no schools will be worse off.

This means disadvantaged schools will get more than they did under the old system – recognising that schools in regional areas, with high numbers of students from poor families, with disability, with English as a second language or Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students, need extra resources. This funding is on top of the usual increases for indexation and for rising enrolment. The extra funding is great news and will do great things at schools across Queensland.

Ending Domestic And Family Violence In Queensland

As the final term for 2015 begins, it is timely to reflect on the role we each can play in ending domestic and family violence in Queensland. Domestic and family violence impacts the whole community and can include physical, verbal, sexual, financial, spiritual, social or psychological control and abuse. Everyone, regardless of their age, socio-economic status, sexuality, gender, culture, race or geographical location can be affected. On average, there are 180 incidents of domestic and family violence each day in Queensland - this is 180 too many!

In February 2015, the *Not Now, Not Ever: Putting an End to Domestic and Family Violence in Queensland report* was released and detailed 140 recommendations for action, all of which were all accepted by the government. Our department is specifically responsible for nine actions and we will contribute to others. Domestic and family violence is insidious and is not tolerated by our department in any of its forms. I am personally committed to ensuring that all members of our Mt Warren Park school community have access to information and support to get help when

it is needed. A recent report identified that within Queensland, the largest number of domestic and family violence reports to Police occur on Sundays. A number of these victims will come through the school gates on Mondays. We will provide you with the information you need to support our students and your families who are affected by domestic and family violence. This will include linking families to external agencies including DVConnect on 1800 811 811. Recent media reports certainly bring the harsh reality of domestic and family violence to our attention. In the lead up to White Ribbon Day on 25 November 2015, it is important we all play a role in showing that domestic and family violence is unacceptable and must not be ignored.

White Ribbon Day — 25 November 2015

White Ribbon is Australia's only national, male led Campaign to end men's violence against women.

Vision – All women live in safety free from all forms of men's violence.

Mission – Making women's safety a man's issue too.

The campaign works through primary prevention initiatives involving awareness raising and education, and programs with youth, [schools](#), [workplaces](#) and across the broader community. Globally, White Ribbon is the world's largest male-led movement to end men's violence against women. Originating in Canada in 1991, White Ribbon is now active in more than [60 countries](#).

White Ribbon began in Australia in 2003 as part of UNIFEM (now UN Women), formally becoming a Foundation in 2007. White Ribbon Australia observes the International Day of the Elimination of Violence against Women, also known as White Ribbon Day, annually on November 25. White Ribbon Day signals the start of the 16 Days of Activism to Stop Violence against Women, which ends on Human Rights Day (December 10). However, the campaign runs all year and is evident across the community through, for example, advertising and marketing campaigns such as [Uncover Secrets](#), social media, [community events](#) and [White Ribbon Night](#) in July.

Endorsement Of The Revised Prep To Year 10

Australian Curriculum

At the Education Council meeting held 18 September 2015, the revised Prep to Year 10 Australian Curriculum was endorsed for eight learning areas. There is no requirement for schools to use the revised Australian Curriculum at this time. Teachers and schools are to focus their energy on consolidating the implementation of the Australian Curriculum Phase 1 subjects and continue to use the Queensland Essential Learnings for the remaining subjects. To support a rollout of the revised curriculum that is mindful of the impact on Queensland schools and teachers, the department will work with stakeholders to determine a way forward.

Next Step Survey 2015 Results Released

The Next Step survey is an annual survey of students who completed Year 12 at state, Catholic and independent schools. It shows the initial study and work destinations of young people after completing school. The survey is conducted by the Department of Education and Training through the Queensland Government statistician's office.

The survey, now in its 11th year, informs parents and the wider community about the diverse pathways young people take after Year 12. It also helps schools, universities, training bodies, business and industry, local government and regional planners review and plan their services and policies.

Under the Annual Reporting Policy for all Queensland schools, schools are required to report Year 12 destination data in their school annual report published by 30 September each year. This year the survey attracted an 80.2 per cent response rate with a total of 40,157 young people completing the 2015 survey.

Triple P –

Positive Parenting Program Now Available In Queensland

Parenting can be hard work; it's okay to ask for help and free help is available. Triple P is a world-renowned parenting program that helps make raising children and teenagers easier. It is available free of charge and on a voluntary basis to all Queensland parents and carers of children up to 16 years.

No matter what stage of life your child is at or what challenges you're facing, Triple P can help you learn simple but proven ways to parent more effectively and give your children the best opportunity to reach their full potential.

The program will give you practical skills and tools, and help build the confidence you need, to:

- manage your children's behaviour
- set family routines and rules that everyone follows
- develop positive relationships, so you can get along well with your kids and argue less
- raise happy, healthy and confident children
- balance work and family without stress
- create a happy, safe environment where your family can thrive.

What support is available?

How much support and what support you receive is totally up to you.

The Triple P program consists of a range of seminars, group workshops and one-on-one consultations, delivered as either one-off sessions or as part of a series of sessions over several weeks or months.

It also includes Triple P Online, an intensive, self-paced online course for parents to learn about the full suite of Triple P parenting strategies.

The range of options available means you can receive as much or as little help as you like, depending on your individual preferences and situation.

How can I access Triple P for free?

Free Triple P seminars, workshops and courses are being rolled out progressively across Queensland.

Letters For Returning & Notification Of Holidays For 2015/2016

Just a reminder to send back the letter (coming out shortly) that tells us your family is continuing at Mt Warren Park SS and when to expect you back as many of our families go away on holidays and do not return for the first day of school. We also need to gather information regarding students who will not be returning to Mt Warren Park SS next year. This information helps us plan our classes and we ask that you send this information back as soon as possible.

ENROLMENTS FOR 2016

Enrolment forms for 2016 for all year levels can be obtained from the office. Please let your neighbours, friends and family members know what an outstanding school Mt Warren Park SS is.

Parents or legal guardians who wish to enroll their child at Mt Warren Park SS will need to demonstrate that the student's principle place of residence is within the catchment area. Current proof of residency at the address indicated can be provided by way of one of each of the following:

One primary source – a current lease agreement, or rates notice, or unconditional sale agreement, and;

One secondary source – a utility bill (e.g. electricity, gas) showing this same address and parent's/legal guardian's name

If you live outside our catchment area please contact us to determine space before completing the enrolment form. Students living outside the catchment area may need to be placed on a waiting list.

A school's local catchment area is the geographical area from which the school is to have its core intake of students. A catchment map defines the catchment area for Mt Warren Park SS. A hard copy of this map is available at the school's administration building and it can be viewed online on the Edmap Website <http://www.qgso.qld.gov.au/maps/edmap/>

Class Placement Requests

Teachers will shortly begin the process of organising students into classes. This will be finalised by Transition Afternoon on Monday 7 December and students will receive a letter to take home to parents advising them of their classes for the 2016 school year on this day. This is the same process that we have used in previous years.

Requests for certain classes for students will only be accepted in writing. Parents need to be aware that class allocations and changes will only occur based on the educational aspects of schooling. Friendship groupings are taken into account by teachers and administration when we form classes.

Please be aware that the configuration of the classes may change as a result of either more or less enrolments than expected. These changes will be decided on our Day 8 (of school) enrolments. **Day 8 next year is Thursday 4 February 2016.** If there are any changes, our school community will be notified as soon as possible after this date.

Attendance Is Important In The Last Weeks Of Term

As we look to the end of Term 4, parents are reminded that children must attend school on every school day unless they have a reasonable excuse for being away, such as illness. The students and teachers are heavily into the process of gathering student achievement information that teachers use to complete reports for parents. Visiting family, being tired, or starting holidays early are not good reasons to be away from school. More information on the importance of regular school attendance is available at

NEW PAYMENT OPTION - BPOINT

Parents will notice a change to the way they can pay school invoices. The new payment method of BPoint is now available as an online payment system.

BPoint can be accessed via ANY Computer or Smart Phone. Payments accepted via Mastercard or VISA and is a secured payment method.

Parents can log into: www.bpoint.com.au/payments/dete. Once you have logged in you will need the information from the school invoice to complete the BPOINT payment page.

Cash Collection Procedures – Cash Window

The Cash Window is located in the Admin Block. We offer several methods of payment being cash, cheque, EFTPOS, B-Point (see above) and Internet Banking. The cash window will be **OPEN every Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday from 8am to 10am.**

Late Payments - It is a solid requirement that all events be paid for by the due date which is stated on all permission / information notes sent home to parents.

Late payments cannot be accepted under any circumstances so please keep updated by checking our newsletter each fortnight.

Refunds - Refunds can only be given in part. This means if there is bus travel involved for the event this is **NOT** refundable. Whether your child attends or not the buses have been booked and need to be paid for. You must complete a "Refund Request" Form available from Administration.

Various items are available over the counter but we cannot guarantee hot food will be available unless it is ordered.
