THE IMPORTANCE OF PREP

"Compared to children who did not attend pre-school, average NAPLAN scores were 20 to 30 points higher among children who had attended some type of pre-school program. Looking at the distribution of test scores according to NAP bands, it is clear that the proportion of children with scores in Band 6 is considerably higher among children who had attended pre-school. For example, only 10% of children who did not attend pre-school had Numeracy scores in Band 6, compared to 22% of children who had participated in a pre-school program." – this effect is after 3 years. Longitudinal Study of Australian Children, Diana Warren and John P. Haisken-DeNew, MIAESR, University of Melbourne.

INVESTING FOR SUCCESS

From 2014 to 2017, the Australian Government has made available, an additional \$794 million in Students First initiative funding to Queensland for state schooling. In 2014 and 2015, \$131 million and \$183 million from this initiative was provided to state schools through the Great Results Guarantee. The remaining \$480 million in additional Students First funding is available across 2016 and 2017. Allocation of the remaining funding in 2016 and 2017 will build on the needs-based method to better direct funding to students and schools requiring the most support. This change in allocative method is reflected in a change in name to "Investing for Success" (I4S). State schools use Investing for Success funding to support students, particularly those most in need, to achieve improved outcomes at all levels of schooling. This initiative will enable schools to identify the aspects of their students' achievements requiring the most support and direct resource use so it makes the most positive difference across 2016 and 2017. To provide surety and continuity of school programs, all state schools will be allocated at least the same amount of Investing for Success funding in 2016 and 2017 as they received through the 2015

Great Results Guarantee. Principals, school staff and communities should work together to identify key areas for investment and programs or activities that are most likely to have a positive effect on student outcomes.

All Queensland state schools, including Independent Public Schools, will enter into an agreement committing them to invest the additional funding to improve student outcomes and school performance. Independent Public Schools must establish their 2016 'Investing for Success' agreement with their school councils. All other state schools are to enter into an agreement with the department. Each school's agreement will outline how the additional funding will be invested in 2016 to improve student outcomes and school performance. Schools will publish agreements on their websites so the community can see how this additional funding is planned to be used. Schools decide how to invest Investing for Success funding and principals are responsible for communicating these decisions to school communities.

Student performance is measured throughout the year and schools will demonstrate to their communities how Investing for Success funding is helping to maximise outcomes for all students, particularly those in most need of support. Schools will report each year on the success of their Investing for Success initiatives. The principal may decide the best forum for communicating the school's progress. This may include publishing a simple snapshot report on the school's website. Reporting of Investing for Success progress must involve a 'traffic light' system to identify the status of each strategy on a three-tier grading - green, amber and red. This reporting will demonstrate if outcomes have been met or exceeded, whether substantial progress has been made, or only limited progress achieved.

Process for developing an agreement

Step 1: Undertake appropriate review and consultation. This should include:

- reviewing strategic planning documents in consultation with your leadership team, including your Strategic Plan, Annual Implementation Plan (AIP) 2015 and draft AIP 2016, School Data Profile and other key documents
- selecting your key area for improvement, for example reading, writing and/or numeracy and/or QCE improvement (in consultation with your leadership team and curriculum leaders). This may have been identified through end of 2015 reviews or your Quadrennial School Review (QSR), and be referenced in your draft AIP
- consulting with curriculum leaders (and your assistant regional director for schools other than Independent Public Schools) to select evidence-based research initiatives and identify targets for your key area
- consulting with school community members (for example, teaching and non-teaching staff, P&C, school council) on the key area for improvement, evidence-based initiatives and proposed actions.

Step 2: Complete the template for your agreement.

All schools have been provided with an agreement template. Use this template to outline your key area for improvement and selected initiatives and actions. Principals will need to electronically sign their agreements before submitting them by email. There is no need to print, hand-sign or scan your agreement.

Step 3: Submit your Investing for Success agreement by 26 February 2016.

Independent Public Schools are to submit their endorsed agreement to IPS@dete.qld.gov.au. Remaining schools are to submit their agreement to their regional office for subsequent approval by the Director-General. Regional office contacts were included in the email containing your 2016 template.

On approval of the agreement, monies will be distributed each term during 2016 using existing school appropriation payment processes.

Step 4: Include your Investing for Success initiatives and targets in 2016 strategic planning documents (the School Plan, AIP, developing performance plans, individual curriculum plans, and others as determined appropriate).

Step 5: Arrange for your approved Investing for Success agreement to be displayed in an easily accessible location on your school website (must be "one click" from the home page).

Step 6: Monitor progress towards targeted Investing for Success outcomes throughout the year and provide updates to your school community using a variety of approaches such as newsletter items, website articles, principal reports to the P&C and/or school council and in the school annual report.

Step 7: Prepare and communicate a final report for the year, which might include a snapshot report of 2016 Investing for Success outcomes made available on your school website. Final reports must use a 'traffic light' system to signal the impact of the initiatives identified in your school's Investing for Success agreement and outcomes achieved:

- green - met or exceeded
- amber - substantial progress
- red - limited progress.

REVIEW OF SCHOOL ADMINISTRATIVE AND SUPPORT STAFF

The Review of School Administrative and Support Staff (RoSAS) is an election commitment of the Queensland Government announced as part of the Letting Teachers Teach: Building a modern teaching profession policy statement. This policy statement acknowledges the valuable role that high quality administrative and support staff play in the successful operation of Queensland state schools and recognises the importance of ensuring that principals and teachers can focus on their core work of educating students. Letting Teachers Teach also identifies the importance of properly rewarding administrative staff for the valuable work they do.

The review will:

Examine arrangements for allocating administrative and support staff resourcing to Queensland state schools. Identify anomalies and other issues in existing allocative methodologies. Develop options for Government to consider in response to identified anomalies and issues and to reflect contemporary expectations for school autonomy and resourcing flexibility. Propose options for implementing revised school administrative and support staff resourcing arrangements, including considering an extended transition to manage available funding.

Scope of the review:

The RoSAS scope is focused on the staffing allocation methodologies for position types in state schools (primary, secondary, special, P-10/12, school of distance education, outdoor and environmental education centres) that are covered by the Public Service Award.

Specifically, it concentrates on five main areas:

- Business Service Manager (BSM) and AAEP/Administration Officer (AO2) classification levels, allocation thresholds and methodology including charge/debit rates from school administration allocations and sufficiency of allocations.
- Schools Officers Grounds and Facilities allocation methodology and classification levels.
- IT Support arrangements.
- Scientific Operations Officer allocation methodology and link to administration allocations.
- Specified, Other than Public Service Award, school or specific purpose site-based positions such as Unit Support Officers, Boat Officers and Education Program Officers.

DAY FOR DANIEL – FRIDAY 30 OCTOBER

The 11th annual Day for Daniel 2015 was held on Friday the 30th October. The Daniel Morcombe Foundation held the first Day for Daniel in November 2005.

The Day for Daniel is a National Day of Action to raise awareness of child safety, protection and harm prevention. It is about educating children and adults about keeping kids safe through child safety and protection initiatives. It aims to help empower our children to Recognise, React and Report if they feel something is not right. Wearing Red and Education is the theme of each Day for Daniel as we strive to have schools, kindergartens, businesses and communities across Australia take action and conduct child safety activities in their local communities to help in Keeping Kids Safe.

The objectives of Day for Daniel are:

- To raise awareness about child safety and protection and to promote a safer community for children.
- To educate children regarding their personal safety and empower them to Recognise, React and Report.
- To provide FREE safety and educational material.
- To honour the memory of Daniel Morcombe.
- To have over 1 million people Australia Wide to participate in Day for Daniel.

Day for Daniel is also an opportunity for Australians to make a statement that crimes against children are not acceptable in modern Australia.

REMINDER

- LETTERS FOR RETURNING & NOTIFICATION OF HOLIDAYS FOR 2015/2016

Just a reminder to send back the letter (coming out shortly) that tells us your family is continuing at Mt Warren Park SS and when to expect you back as many of our families go away on holidays and do not return for the first day of school. We also need to gather information regarding students who will not be returning to Mt Warren Park SS next year. This information helps us plan our classes and we ask that you send this information back as soon as possible.

REMINDER - ENROLMENTS FOR 2016

Enrolment forms for 2016 for all year levels can be obtained from the office. Please let your neighbours, friends and family members know what an outstanding school Mt Warren Park SS is.

Parents or legal guardians who wish to enroll their child at Mt Warren Park SS will need to demonstrate that the student's principle place of residence is within the catchment area. Current proof of residency at the address indicated can be provided by way of one of each of the following:

- One primary source – a current lease agreement, or rates notice, or unconditional sale agreement, and;
- One secondary source – a utility bill (e.g. electricity, gas) showing this same address and parent's/legal guardian's name.

If you live outside our catchment area please contact us to determine space before completing the enrolment form. Students living outside the catchment area may need to be placed on a waiting list. A school's local catchment area is the geographical area from which the school is to have its core intake of students. A catchment map defines the catchment area for Mt Warren Park SS. A hard copy of this map is available at the school's administration building and it can be viewed online on the Edmap Website <http://www.qgso.qld.gov.au/maps/edmap/>

REMINDER - CLASS REQUESTS

Teachers will shortly begin the process of organising students into classes. This will be finalised by Transition Afternoon on Monday 7 December and students will receive a letter to take home to parents advising them of their classes for the 2016

school year on this day. This is the same process that we have used in previous years. Parents need to be aware that class allocations and changes will only occur based on the educational aspects of schooling. Friendship groupings are taken into account by teachers and administration when we form classes. Please be aware that the configuration of the classes may change as a result of either more or less enrolments than expected. These changes will be decided on our Day 8 (of school) enrolments. **Day 8 next year is Thursday 4 February 2016.** If there are any changes, our school community will be notified as soon as possible after this date.

REMINDER - ATTENDANCE IS IMPORTANT IN THE LAST WEEKS OF TERM

As we look to the end of Term 4, parents are reminded that children must attend school on every school day unless they have a reasonable excuse for being away, such as illness. The students and teachers are heavily into the process of gathering student achievement information that teachers use to complete reports for parents. Visiting family, being tired, or starting holidays early are not good reasons to be away from school. NEW SCHOOLS TO OPEN IN 2016 NAMED

Minister for Education Kate Jones has announced the names of three new schools under the Queensland Schools Public Private Partnership Project: Bellmere State School, Griffin State School, and Deebing Heights State School. Bellmere State School will be located in the Caboolture West area, Griffin State School in the Pine Rivers area, and Deebing Heights State School in the Ripley Valley. All three schools will be opened in 2016 for the start of the new school year. The new school in Bellmere has an expected enrolment of about 250 students who will enjoy a suite of modern facilities in the fully-operational stage one. More than 200 students from Prep to Year 6 are expected to begin their new school year at the world-class education facility in Griffin. The third school, Deebing Heights, will cater for prep to Year 6, and will accommodate 953 students and up to 100 staff.

Prep 2016 Enrolment Process

If you have a child born 1st July 2010 – 31st July 2011, please contact the office and leave your details so that we can arrange an appointment time. We invite both parent and child to attend, as the interview process helps the school to build an understanding of the child's developmental needs and interest before they commence school. As stated in the Education Act 2006, the school requires evidence of date of birth, therefore we ask that parents to bring the child's birth certificate to be sighted and copied by Administration. We also request for parents to give the school a copy of their child's Kindergarten/Day Care Centre's Transition Statement and any other relevant documentation i.e. Court Orders, Paediatrician/Specialist Reports.

Transition Afternoon – Circle the Calendar!

On Monday 7 December our school will conduct a transition afternoon where students are promoted to their classroom year level for 2016. This year both Windaroo Valley SHS and Beenleigh SHS will be holding their orientation days on the Monday 7 December so that afternoon will be our opportunity to promote the rest of our school into their 2016 classes from 2:00p.m. until the end of the day. This transition allows the children to know their teacher, classroom, and classmates for next year and allows them to feel comfortable when returning to school in 2016.

NEW PAYMENT OPTION - BPOINT

Parents will notice a change to the way they can pay school invoices. The new payment method of BPoint is now available as an online payment system.

BPoint can be accessed via **ANY** Computer or Smart Phone. Payments accepted via Mastercard or VISA and is a secured payment method. Parents can log into: www.bpoint.com.au/payments/dete. Once you have logged in you will need the information from the school invoice to complete the BPOINT payment page.



Cash Collection Procedures – Cash Window

The Cash Window is located in the Admin Block. We offer several methods of payment being cash, cheque, EFTPOS, B-Point (see above) and Internet Banking. The cash window will be **OPEN every Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday from 8am to 10am**.

Late Payments - It is a solid requirement that all events be paid for by the due date which is stated on all permission / information notes sent home to parents.

Late payments cannot be accepted under any circumstances so please keep updated by checking our newsletter each fortnight.

Refunds - Refunds can only be given in part. This means if there is bus travel involved for the event this is **NOT** refundable. Whether your child attends or not the buses have been booked and need to be paid for. You must complete a "Refund Request" Form available from Administration.

Current Cash Collections


