Parents Are Listened To At Mt Warren Park

I just wanted to say a HUGE THANK YOU to one of our parents who emailed me about a shade structure for our students waiting for buses in the afternoons. I had been thinking in the weeks previous that the weather will be getting hotter and the summer storms would begin towards the end of term and our kids would need some shelter while they wait.



The parent email reminded me and in the last week of last term we began getting quotes for a shade/rain shelter for our kids – they deserve the best after all! Hopefully we will be able to install in the next couple of weeks ready for the hot and stormy Australian summer!! I'll keep you posted.

Safety Before School

Just a reminder that students are to remain seated in the undercover area before heading to the Hall for supervision before school each morning. Students are reminded that they are to walk (not run) during this time in order to stay safe.

Improvement Priority – Attendance

I would like to remind all our parents how important it is that all students attend school every day.

Our school agenda promotes four key messages:

- All children should attend on every school day.
- We will continue to monitor your child's attendance
- We will continue to phone you if you haven't given us a reasonable excuse for your child's absence
- We will notify the appropriate departments if your child has continued, unexplained, and/or unreasonable reasons for school non-attendance.

Attendance at school is the responsibility of everyone in the community. We know that students can get sick from time to time, so please notify the office of any legitimate absences. We thank you for your support in achieving the best educational results for your children. If parents do not provide reasonable explanations, we then have to have a meeting with you about your child's absences, and if attendance patterns do not change we must then notify the relevant agencies. This week we have sent out some more letters where we have unexplained absences. If you have received one of these letters, please contact the school to let us know the reasons your child/ren have been absent and we can update our records. Attendance every single day is vitally important for your child's future opportunities.

Parent – Teacher Interviews Tuesday 29 November

On Tuesday 29 November from after school to approximately 8.45pm, our teachers will be holding Parent-Teacher Interviews. At the interviews, teachers will discuss the report card and their students' progress this semester. Parents will receive their copy of the report card at the interview. Parents who do not attend the interviews will be able to pick the report cards up the class teacher.



All interviews will be conducted in the Hall. The interviews will be timed. It is vitally important that you arrived 5 minutes before your scheduled interview time so that you do not miss out on your time.

Changes To Prep Enrolment Procedures

When do children start Prep in Queensland?

Queensland children are eligible to attend the Preparatory Year (Prep) if they are 5 years old by 30 June in the year they plan to attend Prep. This means that children born in July to December would attend Prep in the year after they turn 5 years old. For children who are younger than 5 by 30 June in the year they plan to attend Prep, there are legislative provisions for principals to approve early enrolment in only very specific circumstances.

Who is eligible for early entry to Prep?

Age eligibility

- Based on age criteria, early entry to Prep is only a potential option if the child turns 5 years by 31 July in the year they plan to attend Prep.
- Early entry to Prep is an exception, not the rule. A July birthday does not guarantee early entry to Prep in Queensland. Students from interstate and overseas
- Children who have started schooling that is equivalent to the Prep Year in another country or Australian state or territory may be eligible for Prep, on the condition that the principal is satisfied that the child has the attributes required by legislation.
- Previous school enrolment in another country, state or territory does not guarantee early entry to Prep. These are the only circumstances in which early entry to Prep is permitted under Queensland legislation and they apply to all schools in Queensland.

What are the expectations about Prep entry?

A positive transition to schooling is essential for a child's future success. Students approved for early entry to Prep will be expected to attend school on every school day and will be taught and learn about all areas of the Australian Curriculum at a younger age than usual. A child will only be enrolled early in Prep if the principal is satisfied that the child has the required attributes, and early enrolment will be in the child's best interest. For example, while a child may be highly capable in reading or counting, they might not have developed the social or emotional maturity required for success at school.

What are the attributes and why are they important for early entry to Prep?

It is a legislative requirement for principals to assess children for early entry to Prep according to four attributes:

- aptitude and ability;
- social and emotional competence;
- physical development; and
- level of knowledge and understanding.

Aptitude and ability

Aptitude and ability are demonstrated in a number of ways, for example, demonstrating persistence when completing difficult tasks, confidently communicating with other children and adults, and accurately recalling events.

Social and emotional competence

Young children with social and emotional competence feel safe in a learning environment, can ask for help if they need it, are organised and cooperative, and can easily interact and work with others. Social and emotional competence is vital for Prep students to engage in learning.

Physical development

A student's physical development can influence their ability to successfully engage in a range of learning activities. Students need to be able to stay alert for the duration of the school day every day of the week. Being coordinated and having good muscle control will assist a child to engage in writing and other classroom activities. While it is expected that toileting accidents may happen occasionally with younger students, a child who frequently requires assistance to toilet will not be gaining the full benefits of education and these incidents may affect the child in other ways.

Level of knowledge and understanding

When children have a diverse range of knowledge and understanding, they are more likely to engage and experience success with the curriculum expectations in Prep. This includes the ability to recount events, express ideas, hypothesise and propose solutions, demonstrate reading and writing awareness and conventions, and understand mathematical language and early/foundation concepts.

How might a child be affected if they enrol in Prep too early?

If a child is enrolled in Prep before they are ready for school, there may be unintended consequences, such as the following:

- The child may experience undue pressure because he or she is not yet socially and emotionally mature enough to cope with the demands of full-time schooling.
- Self-confidence and attitudes to school could be adversely affected, in the short and/or long term, if the child struggles to cope with the educational expectations in their Prep Year.
- The child may not be able to sustain relationships with classroom peers who will be older than them.

How does the principal determine a child's eligibility for early entry to Prep?
The principal, in consultation with other relevant personnel, e.g. Prep teachers, head of curriculum, deputy principal, guidance officer, will assess the child's attributes based on the following:

- information provided in the application form;
- discussion with the child's parent/carer about the child's attributes;
- observations of the child made by school staff; and
- school readiness screening/assessment (if required).

If the principal determines that the child has the required attributes to enter Prep early, the school will provide the parent with the school's enrolment application package. If the child has not yet developed all of the attributes required for early entry to Prep, they are not eligible for enrolment.

What is the process for a parent to apply for early entry to Prep?

If a parent believes early entry to Prep would be in their child's best interests and that their child has the necessary attributes, the parent should do the following:

1. Contact the school - Contact the principal (or senior management team member) of the school. For state schools, it is recommended that you contact the school in early October prior to the new school year. You will be provided with information about early entry requirements and the application process.

2. Request an Application form - Request an Application form for Early Entry to Prep from the principal (or senior management team member) of the school.

3. Provide documents to the school - If you believe your child has the necessary attributes for early entry to Prep, provide the school with a completed application form and supporting evidence, for example, samples of your child's work.

4. Meet with the principal - The principal (or senior management team member) of the school will meet with you to discuss the application.

5. Be aware that school staff will observe your child - School staff will observe your child while he/she engages in educational activities. Your child may also possibly undertake a standardised screening or assessment with your permission if the principal considers this is necessary.

6. Receive the principal's decision - The principal will provide written advice to you as to whether your child is eligible for early entry to Prep at that school based on the assessment of your child's attributes.

Do You Have A Child Starting School In 2017? - Supporting Successful Transitions

Do you have a child starting school in 2017? Schools, early childhood education and care services and families all have a part to play in helping children enjoy a positive start to school.

Information for families

Starting school is an exciting and significant time in every child's life. A positive start to school can lead to children developing a lifelong love of learning. We encourage our families to work in partnership with Mt Warren Park SS to ensure all children enjoy a successful transition to school. Invitations for our new Prep Parents have gone out for our Prep Orientation Evening on Tuesday 11 October in the Hall at 6.00pm. (See the advert in this newsletter also.)

What is transition to school?

Transition to school begins well before a child starts school and ends when your child feels safe, secure and a sense of belonging at school. It involves a range of partners working together to provide experiences that will help your child gain the skills and confidence they need to adjust to their new school environment.

Orientation activities that help your child become familiar with their new school environment and routines are an important component of your child's transition to school.

What does it mean for my child?

Successful transition can improve social skills, reduce behavioural problems and ultimately improve academic outcomes. All partners in your child's support network will play an important role in your child's transition to school. Your child's early childhood education and care service, our school and relevant community organisations will work together to help you and your child feel prepared for and confident to start school.



How can I help prepare my child for school?

Children who can play cooperatively with others, explain their thoughts, ideas and feelings and follow routines and directions are socially and emotionally prepared for school. There are many simple ways you as a parent can encourage your child's development of these skills.

Talking with your child about what they see and understand about everyday family events is a simple way you can support your child's development.

Reading together, especially stories about change or starting school will develop your child's language, thinking and literacy skills. Visit your local library or ask your child's early childhood teacher for recommendations on books to read.

Enrolling your child in a Queensland Government-approved kindergarten program is an important way you can help prepare them for Prep. Kindergarten programs help children develop a love of learning, build their confidence and make friends in the year before they start school.

As it gets closer to the start of school, set up a morning and evening routine to help reduce the number of changes they will experience. The routine can include packing their lunch box, dressing themselves, practising the trip to school.

Helping your child to work out answers to problems or concerns will help them develop coping strategies and make them more independent and confident. Encourage them to ask for help if they need it and talk to their new Prep teacher, another staff member or an older 'school buddy' about their concerns.

Talk to your child's early childhood teacher to get their suggestions for other ways you can help prepare your child for school.

How can I support my child's transition to school?

You have an important role in your child's transition to school. Here are some helpful hints on ways you can support them:

- get to know other Prep children and their families as soon as appropriate, as building these relationships can foster a sense of belonging for you and your child
- know your child's concerns and provide comfort and support by talking together
- speak positively about their new school
- get to know your child's new school and the staff by participating in any school orientation activities
- contribute to the development of your child's Transition Statement and provide a copy of the completed statement to your child's Prep teacher.

As a parent, you know your child best. Talking to the Prep teacher about your child's other prior to school experiences will also help them understand and prepare to meet your child's learning, social and emotional needs.



From the Deputy Principals



School Leadership 2017 Process



The first step in our 2017 School Leadership Accreditation is now well underway. Students wanting to apply for the position of a Senior Leader need to complete the Senior Card and then hand it into the office by Monday 31st October. Students who successfully complete the program will be awarded a Senior Badge and expected to fulfil certain responsibilities in the school community from the time of receiving the badge. These students will then be

eligible to nominate for School Leadership positions such as School Captain. The timeline for the School Captaincy Process will commence once students have received their Senior Badge. Students will be given a nomination form if they choose to go in the running for a School Captain position. These nomination forms are then due back to the office by Tuesday 1st November. Interviews will then be held on Thursday 3rd November with a selected panel comprising of the Deputy Principal, Staff member and P&C member. Once students hand in their nomination form, it is suggested that they start preparing for their interview as soon as possible, collecting academic and extra-curricular reports/awards and preparing possible answers etc. The announcement of the School Captain candidates will be announced on Parade on Monday 7th November and then their week of campaigning in the school community will be begin (8th November - 17th November). Candidates will make speeches to the school community before a student and staff voting process on Thursday 17th November. The announcement of our chosen School Captains for 2017 will be held on parade on Monday 21st November.

Cash Collection Procedures – Cash Window

The Cash Window is located in the Admin Block. We offer several methods of payment being cash, cheque, EFTPOS, B-Point and Internet Banking. The cash window will be **OPEN every Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday from 8am to 10am.**

Late Payments - It is a solid requirement that all events be paid for by the due date which is stated on all permission / information notes sent home to parents.

Late payments cannot be accepted under any circumstances so please keep updated by checking our newsletter each fortnight.

Refunds - Refunds can only be given in part. This means if there is bus travel involved for the event this is **NOT** refundable. Whether your child attends or not the buses have been booked and need to be paid for. You must complete a "Refund Request" Form available from Administration.

Payment Due Dates - Every fortnight payment reminders are printed in the "General News" and "Dates To Remember" sections of the school newsletter (this is also available on our website).



B-Point can be accessed via **ANY** Computer or Smart Phone. Payments accepted via Mastercard or VISA and is a secured payment method. Parents can log into: www.bpoint.com.au/payments/dete. Once you have logged in you will need the information from the school invoice to complete the BPOINT payment page.

Year 3 And 4 Swimming Program

Mt Warren Park State School will be again in 2016 conducting the school "Learn To Swim" program in Term 4. Our program will be conducted by qualified and experienced swimming instructors. The program will include both swimming safety and stroke correction and improvement. As this is a major outcome in the curriculum we strongly encourage all students to participate. The swimming program will commence on Monday 14 November 2016 and conclude on Friday 25 November 2016. The program will run for one 45 minute lesson each day over a total of two weeks. The total cost of the program will be \$80.00. This cost covers bus travel and pool admission and a qualified instructor for forty-five minutes over 10 lessons. Please note: This is not a form to select a particular teacher for next year. It has 3 sections – Social Skills, Academic Issues, and Special Needs.
