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## From the Principal



Dear Parents

It's hard to believe that the first term is nearly over with under two weeks to go until the Easter holidays. I would like to thank all members of the school community for their support of the school for the start of 2017. We are starting to see a steady improvement in some of the behaviours of the students and the standard of uniform is continuing to impress me.

There will be a focus on the uniform at the beginning of Term 2 and students will have many conversations with members of the Admin Team over what is considered appropriate to ensure our high standards are being met. Mount Warren Park is a uniformed school and this has been ratified and supported by our school P&C. The purpose of the school uniform is ultimately designed for the safety of our students while in the school or on excursions but it also plays a pivotal role in promoting the culture of learning at our school.

### JUMPERS:

With the cold weather now just around the corner – parents are being reminded to start ensuring their children have the necessary winter uniforms ready for the coming months. Students are required to be in full school uniform in winter and the school dress code states clearly that jumpers MUST be either the official winter jumper available from the uniform shop OR a plain black jumper. Plain black jumpers can be purchased from most department stores for a reasonable price. These black jumpers are PLAIN BLACK and should not have any logos or colours on them.

### SCHOOL PRIORITIES:

As parents – are you aware of the key priorities we are focusing on this year at Mt Warren Park State School?

They are:

1. Reading
2. A Positive School Culture
3. Attendance



### GALA DAY SPORT:

I have been fortunate enough to head out to watch some of our sportsmen and women on the sporting fields over the last two Fridays and I have been very impressed with the standard of play from all teams I have seen so far but more impressed with the manners and sportsmanship displayed by our students. It is also terrific to see the number of parents able to get out and support not only your own child but our school in their various fields of endeavour. I am looking forward to meeting more parents on the sidelines of sporting fields in coming weeks and finding out more about your child and how we are travelling as a school.

### POSITIVE NEWS:

Last Friday we received an email from a parent of Mount Warren Park SS letting us know of the actions of another student at the school. Too often – on a daily basis there are multiple examples of positive behaviour in the school and in our school community from our students but many times it goes un noticed while the more negative behaviours get reported on.

The actions of one our senior students – Tyrell was brought to our attention when he independently assisted one of our younger students by helping him prepare for a presentation to his class.



Congratulations Tyrell on a great effort and being a responsible learner. This is another example of the behaviours we are coming to expect from our students from MWPS.

### BIKES AT SCHOOL:

A reminder to parents and students – bikes and scooters that are brought to school by students must be wheeled directly to the bike racks and locked up for the day. Other students are not permitted to enter the bike enclosure throughout the school day for any purpose.

I have noticed of late a tendency for many of the students with bikes to ride them down the path at the end of the school day and then out of the school grounds. Apart from this practice being extremely dangerous to others using the path, it is against the school rules. Students are expected to wheel their bikes out on foot to the front of the school gate and then to ride them home safely from there. Students still riding their bikes down the path, endangering other students will have their bikes taken off them and parents called to come to pick them up.

### LATE TO SCHOOL:

Our focus has been of late on students late to school. The following figures are the number of students arriving late to school during Week 7 and Week 8:

Week 7 = 91 students (41 students from P-3 + 50 students from Yr 3-6)  
Week 8 = 111 students (49 students from P-3 + 62 students from Yr 3-6)

These figures are way too high and parents need to ensure their child is ready to start the school day at 8:50am with the rest of the class and their teacher. The habit of turning up to school late and regularly is disruptive to the student, to the class and to the teacher. Students late to class also often miss key concepts being investigated by the class.

### HAPPY EASTER:

With this newsletter being the last for this term – I trust all families will have a safe and restful break over the Easter holidays and please remember that school starts again for Term 2 on Tuesday 18<sup>th</sup> April. The last day of Term 1 will be on Friday 31<sup>st</sup> March. This is a normal school day and students are expected to be in attendance and in full school uniform.



### Social Growth and Personal Attributes Reports

Our school Social Growth and Personal Attributes Reports will be sent home on Thursday the 23<sup>rd</sup> of March. These reports are designed to give you a quick snapshot of your child's application and behavioural progress so far this year and are also a great springboard to have an interview with your child's teacher. It is important that we have strong communication channels between home and school and an interview is strongly recommended to enable you to meet the person who will play such an important part in your child's life this year.

Parent Interviews will be conducted during the last week of this term and please take the opportunity to make an appointment with your child's teacher.

### Team Up

Eleven children from our year 5 and 6 classes have been participating in **Team Up** this term and have been developing their leadership skills through communication, anti-bullying and self-defence strategies, assertiveness and scenario based training in order to encourage their positive decision making and cooperation. These activities have been presented through the PCYC and all of the children involved have shown that they have gained a lot from their experiences. The children are excited to attend the program and have increased their personal resilience and developed skills and attitudes to enable participants to contribute positively to their own safety and wellbeing; giving them a number of tools to benefit them in later life.



### NAPLAN

Our year 3, and 5 students have been practicing hard for the NAPLAN tests that will be held on Tuesday 9 May to Thursday 11 May. These tests are an important component of National Data gathering and all children in years 3 and 5 at Mount Warren Park State School will be required to complete these tests. There is, however, scope for some children to be withdrawn from the testing, be exempt or to complete the tests under special consideration conditions. If you wish to withdraw your child from the testing procedures, feel that your child should be exempt from the tests or wish for them to complete the tests under special circumstances please let your child's teacher know of this as letters advising of children eligible for withdrawal, special consideration or exemption will be sent home in term 2. If you receive a letter please complete it and return it to your child's teachers as soon as possible.



### Emergency Procedures Drills

In the near future our school will be holding emergency procedure drills. These drills will consist of either evacuation or lockdown drills and help us to evaluate our school safety procedures and to help prepare the students in the event of an emergency. Please inform your child of these events and stress to them the importance of remaining calm and sensible during the drills.

### Sun Safe Hats

It is important that all children have a sun safe uniform hat with them at school at all times. Children will be required to sit in the covered area during play time if they do not have a sun safe hat.

### Every Day Counts

At Mount Warren Park we want your child here 100% of the time. Being at school ensures smooth transitions, it allows for deeper understanding and it makes it easy for students to keep up with the learning that is going on in their classroom. Attendance is a direct indicator of success at school. So please have your student here at school every day to support their best opportunity for success.

## General School News



### Cash Collection Procedures – Cash Window

The Cash Window is located in the Admin Block. We offer several methods of payment being cash, cheque, EFTPOS, B-Point and Internet Banking. The cash window will be **OPEN every Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday from 8am to 10am.**

**Late Payments** - It is a solid requirement that all events be paid for by the due date which is stated on all permission / information notes sent home to parents.

Late payments cannot be accepted under any circumstances so please keep updated by checking our newsletter each fortnight.

**Refunds** - Refunds can only be given in part. This means if there is bus travel involved for the event this is **NOT** refundable. Whether your child attends or not the buses have been booked and need to be paid for. You must complete a "Refund Request" Form available from Administration.

**Payment Due Dates** - Every fortnight payment reminders are printed in the "General News" and "Dates To Remember" sections of the school newsletter (this is also available on our website).



### B-POINT IS OUR PREFERRED METHOD OF PAYMENT

**B-Point** can be accessed via **ANY** Computer or Smart Phone. Payments accepted via Mastercard or VISA and is a secured payment method. Parents can log into: [www.bpoint.com.au/payments/dete](http://www.bpoint.com.au/payments/dete). Once you have logged in you will need the information from the school invoice to complete the BPOINT payment page. An Instruction Sheet can be collected from the office if needed.
